

IN THE BEGINNING...

For the first time in 30+ years, Lori Renshaw (Colby), who passed away suddenly in September 2010, was not in charge of planning our class reunion. To carry on the task, the "Oxnard High School Class of 1963 Reunion Planning Committee" met in Camarillo on December 15, 2012, for its first organizational meeting.

Four active committee members subsequently met once or twice a month and spent many hours discussing and deciding the myriad things that go into planning a successful reunion. Throughout the months prior to the Reunion, the committee made a concerted group effort to plan a very special 50th Class Reunion.

Fred Clay who lives in Alta Loma, was chosen "Chairman" of the committee. Fred spent four hours commuting, to and from his home in Alta Loma, to come to Camarillo or Oxnard for each meeting. Besides conducting the committee meetings, his responsibilities included opening and maintaining a checking account, keeping track of income and expenses, signing contracts, and acting as the Master of Ceremonies at the Reunion.

Believing most class members had internet access and email addresses, and that it was time to bring our promotional and communication efforts into the digital age, Phil Corpus took over the communication and database update responsibilities. Phil designed a Class Reunion website to give the OHS Class of '63 a unique online presence, as well as where he could post up-to-date information about the Reunion. He then conducted postal mail, and email campaigns to update the class database. The campaign's primary objective was to collect email addresses so reunion registration materials and other information could be sent by email instead of postal mail, thus saving stationery and postage costs. Recently, Phil setup the "OHS Class of '63 Facebook Page" to increase the class' online presence. It is hoped some of our "missing" classmates will find the website or the Facebook Page and reconnect.

The other committee members are Rita Hernandez (Herzstein) and Tomasa "Tommie" Borroel. Both provided and helped brainstorm many ideas for the Reunion. Rita recommended and contracted with the DJ who provided the music. Together, Rita and Tommie designed, and hand-assembled, the fifteen beautiful centerpieces that enhanced the dining and display tables. They supervised the sign-in process at the Reunion and kept the attendees moving smoothly.

THE RESULT...

The culmination of the Committee's efforts occurred on September 21, 2013, when a total of 130 class members, spouses, and guests gathered for a fun-filled evening that included a happy hour with hors d'oeuvres, a delicious buffet dinner that included three entrees, a Power Point presentation of 1960's history, regular and 'special' door prize drawings, special recognition awards, brief Open-Mic statements from Reunion attendees, dancing to 50's and 60's music, plenty of hugs, and the rekindling of many old friendships.

The evening began with a sign-in rush that began early and threatened to get out of control. After a few adjustments, the sign-in process progressed smoothly as attendees collected their name badges, door prize tickets, and had their photos taken. Then, it was into the dining room lobby area for happy hour and hors d'ouerves. After happy hour and a final head count, everyone enjoyed an excellent buffet dinner and conversation with old friends.

After dinner, Fred Clay did a PowerPoint presentation of Oxnard history and highlights of the Sixties (a copy of his presentation will be included on the "50th Reunion Photo Memory Disc"). Then, it was on to door prize awards, Open-Mic, special recognition awards, the "mystery" person award, and the centerpiece giveaway. Afterwards, the dance floor was cleared and those who wanted to kick up their heels did so while others stepped into the lobby to continue conversing and reconnecting with old friends.

Continuing the 50th Reunion celebration the next day, a no-host "Day After Picnic" was held at Oxnard's Eastwood Park. Some 40 attendees brought their own picnic lunches and beverages and enjoyed a pleasant afternoon of additional conversation and reminiscing with fellow class members.
